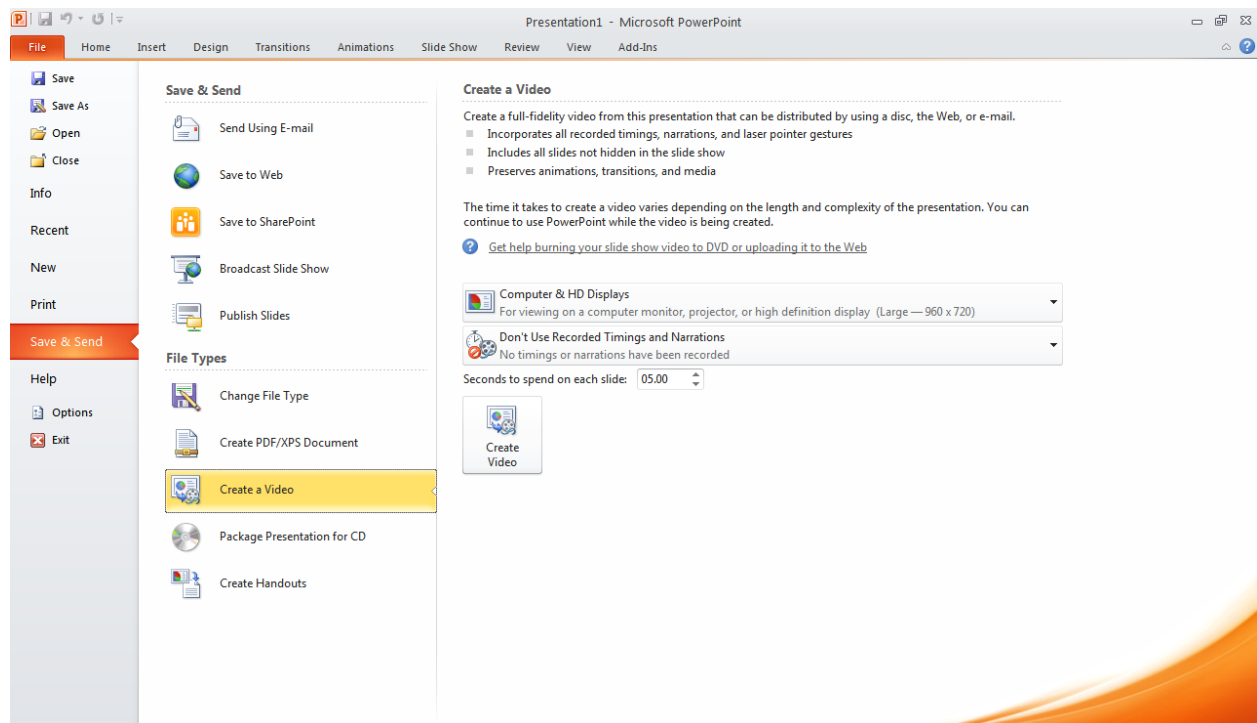


Creating a WMV Video File From Microsoft Powerpoint 2010

Here is an easy way to get your content from Microsoft Powerpoint 2010 to a WMV video file so you can use this content on any of the B1080P or B1080PX players. This is only valid for Powerpoint 2010, this feature is not available for any previous versions.

The first step is to build your Powerpoint file as you like. Since this is being automated, be sure to add timings to each of the slides or you can let the application do it at the end.

When finished, click the File menu and click Save and Send.



From here select the type of display this will be seen on (use Large). If you want to use the timings you used in the presentation, leave the Timings and Narrations alone. If you want each slide to display for a particular amount of time, change it to the number of seconds desired. When finished, click the Create Video icon.

Save it to the desired location and then transfer it to your CF card, SD Card or USB drive and you are done. Don't forget to make sure that there are no spaces in the file names.
